

# 2026 GTQG Quilt Show

## Artist/Quilter Collaboration

For this category you should find an artist to work with and make an art quilt based on a piece of their art.

The artwork can be any size and medium. We would love to see paintings, photographs or sculptures. The quilt can also be any size and method. The art and quilts will not be sold at the show, but we will be happy to put up signage with the artists' information. If the art is to be hung it should be entered with a wire attached. If the piece is too large or heavy to hang from our poles the artist should provide an easel to be turned in and picked up with the artwork.

There will be a separate entrance form for this category. It will have a place for all the measurements and descriptions of the art and the quilts. If you would like your quilt to be judged, that will be an option, and the cost will be \$10. It is not a requirement to have your quilt judged. The artwork will not be judged. The forms, pictures and fee (if quilt will be judged) must be turned in by November 20<sup>th</sup>. They can be given directly to me at a guild meeting or mailed to my home address: 4060 Inverness Dr. Beaumont, TX 77707.

If we get at least 6 entries, the quilts will be judged based on artistic qualities and how they relate to the artwork. They will not be judged based on traditional rules. Please feel free to be super creative and have fun with this! I would love to see a hairy bigfoot quilt, just sayin!

Intake for this category will be the same date and time as general show intake, but it will be separate. Jan Peveto and I will be there in the lobby to accept all the entries. If an easel is needed it should be brought in with the artwork. Pickup will be at the close of the show and all artwork and quilts must be picked up at that time.
