Meet the Judges

Lisa Erlandson is a self-described compulsive quilt collector whose passion has grown into a wide-ranging career in all things quilt-related. She is an AQS Certified Quilt Appraiser, respected lecturer, judge, teacher, quilt historian, and researcher.



Lisa is a founding member of the Lone Star Quilt Study Group. She has appeared multiple times on *The Quilt Show* with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims, and is the co-founder of the Research Rave Syndicate—a program designed to empower and encourage new quilt researchers.

Though she learned to sew as a child (and once considered it a punishment), Lisa rediscovered stitching in the mid-1980s while working as a drama teacher. Her quilting journey began in earnest with her first quilt in 1991—and she’s never looked back.

Lisa holds a Master of Arts in Public Communication from the University of North Texas. She taught junior high, high school, and college before fully dedicating herself to the quilt world she now calls home.

Diane Leclair, NACQJ

Originally from Maine, Diane (De) is a self-taught appliqué artist who has been creating quilts since 1981. Her work reflects the rich colors of nature and highlights her deep passion for appliqué and embroidery. Known for her exquisite hand quilting, De is also an accomplished long-arm quilter. Her award-winning quilts have been featured in numerous local, regional, and national shows, earning six Best of Show Awards, six Viewers' Choice Awards, Merit Hand Quilting Awards, and a Best Machine Quilting Award. De is also the proud recipient of the distinguished Masterpiece Quilt Award from the National Quilt Association for her quilt *Coeur du Vigne*.



“Judging is a natural extension of my passion for quilting. I believe it’s important to encourage and support growth within the quilting community at every level. I’m continually inspired by the creativity and artistry quilters bring to their work. Above all, I love the art of quilting and the sense of closeness it fosters among us all.”

De earned her Judging Certification through the National Quilting Association in 2002 and became qualified to evaluate Masterpiece Quilts the following year. She is also a charter member of the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges (NACQJ).

Artist’s Statement

“Judging is a thoughtful and serious process for me. Each quilt maker invests tremendous time, care, and creativity into their work, and I believe that deserves my full attention. A judge’s written critique serves as an important learning opportunity—it’s my chance to acknowledge the maker’s achievements and to offer insight into areas for growth. I look for excellence in workmanship, whether by hand or machine, that enhances the quilt maker’s design expression. I treasure every aspect of quilting and remain continually inspired by the innovative ways quilters bring their ideas to life.”

Marilyn Hardy of Tyler, Texas was one of the founding members of the Quilters Guild of East Texas. Through the years she has served her guild in many capacities, including president, quilt show chairman, judging coordinator, and newsletter editor. For her service to the guild, she was honored with a lifetime membership.

It was through her volunteering as quilt show judging coordinator that Marilyn became interested in the process of judging quilt shows.

She began judging and went further to become a National Quilting Association Certified Judge in 2008. She is one of the charter members of the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges.

For Marilyn quilting is more than a hobby—it is a major focus, and her judging is an outgrowth of her passion for quilts. Marilyn explains, “As a quilt show judge, I recognize, reward, and encourage excellence in quilt design, workmanship, and creativity. My hope is that the comments I make as a judge will be insightful, helpful, and encouraging to those quilters who have dedicated themselves to starting and finishing a quilt.”

What Were Those Judges Thinking? *Some insights into what our judges look for.*

There are over 300 quilts being judge in this year's show. Here's a brief snapshot of the criteria that go into judging quilt entries.

Design and Visual Impact

The design of the quilt top, including fabric choices, sashings, borders, and overall finishing, should demonstrate thoughtful planning and artistic cohesion. Elements such as line, shape, color, texture, and value should be used effectively to create a visually engaging composition. The overall design should feel balanced, harmonious, and well-proportioned, drawing the viewer's eye naturally across the quilt while maintaining unity and interest throughout.

General Workmanship

Accuracy and precision are essential. Piecing should be secure with well-matched corners, sharp points, and consistent seam allowances. Thread type and color should be appropriate to the fabric and construction. Borders should be straight and smooth, free of ripples or puckering. Appliqué pieces should lie flat, with edges cleanly finished and securely attached, reflecting careful workmanship and attention to detail throughout the quilt.

Quilting

The quilting method chosen by the maker should enhance and complement the overall design of the quilt top. Quilting should effectively fill the spaces and remain in pleasing proportion to the design elements. Stitches should be even and consistent, with balanced tension visible on both the front and back of the quilt, demonstrating control, skill, and attention to detail.

Ribbons

- ***First (blue), Second (red), Third (white) and Honorable Mention (pink)***, are awarded in each category at the discretion of the Judge. Ribbons are displayed with the winning quilt.
- Some quilts have 2 - 1st place ribbons - a separate ribbon is given to the quilter if different from the maker.
- ***The Best of Show*** winner will be moved to the front of the exhibit area. The winner of Best of Show is selected by all the Judges from winners in all categories.
- ***Judge's Choice*** is chosen by each Judge as a personal choice.
- ***Past President's Choice*** is chosen by the previous Guild President as a personal choice and the quilt she would choose to take home with her.
- ***Viewer's Choice*** is awarded based on the most votes of those who attend the show. The ribbon will be award about 2:00 PM on the final day of the show.
- ***Block Contest: First, Second, Third and Honorable Mention*** ribbons are award. The blocks will be used for future donation quilt for the guild.
- ***Entrant*** ribbons are worn by all guild members who entered quilts in the show.
- ***Vendor*** ribbons are worn by vendors for identification.
